**Цель освоения дисциплины (модуля)** - - формирование знаний, умений и навыков, обеспечивающих возможность применения иностранного языка в межличностном общении и профессиональной деятельности, а также развитие способности к коммуникации в устной и письменной формах на иностранном языке для решения задач межличностного и межкультурного взаимодействия.
